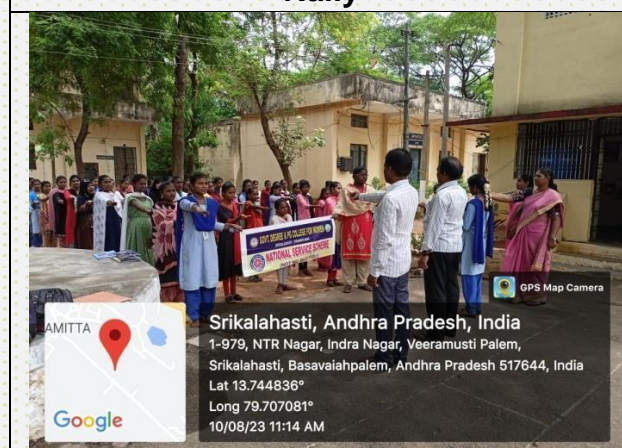

## Congratulations to ISRO

Nineteen minutes when all eyes were riveted on their screens; 19 minutes when India's Vikram landed on a side of the moon where nobody has gone before. India's moon mission, Chandrayaan-3, achieved the softest of landings for Vikram on the surface of the moon's near side (facing the earth), near the South Pole.

The 19 minutes began at 5:44 pm IST on August 23. It was the moment when, from an altitude of 30 km above the moon, the Automatic Landing Sequence (ALS), a sophisticated computer on board Vikram, took charge of operations based on the instructions it had received some three hours earlier. All that the magnificent crew at ISRO could do now was sit back and hope that their hard work paid off. And pay off it did, with all four stages of the powered descent—rough braking, altitude-hold, fine braking, and terminal descent — going off flawlessly.

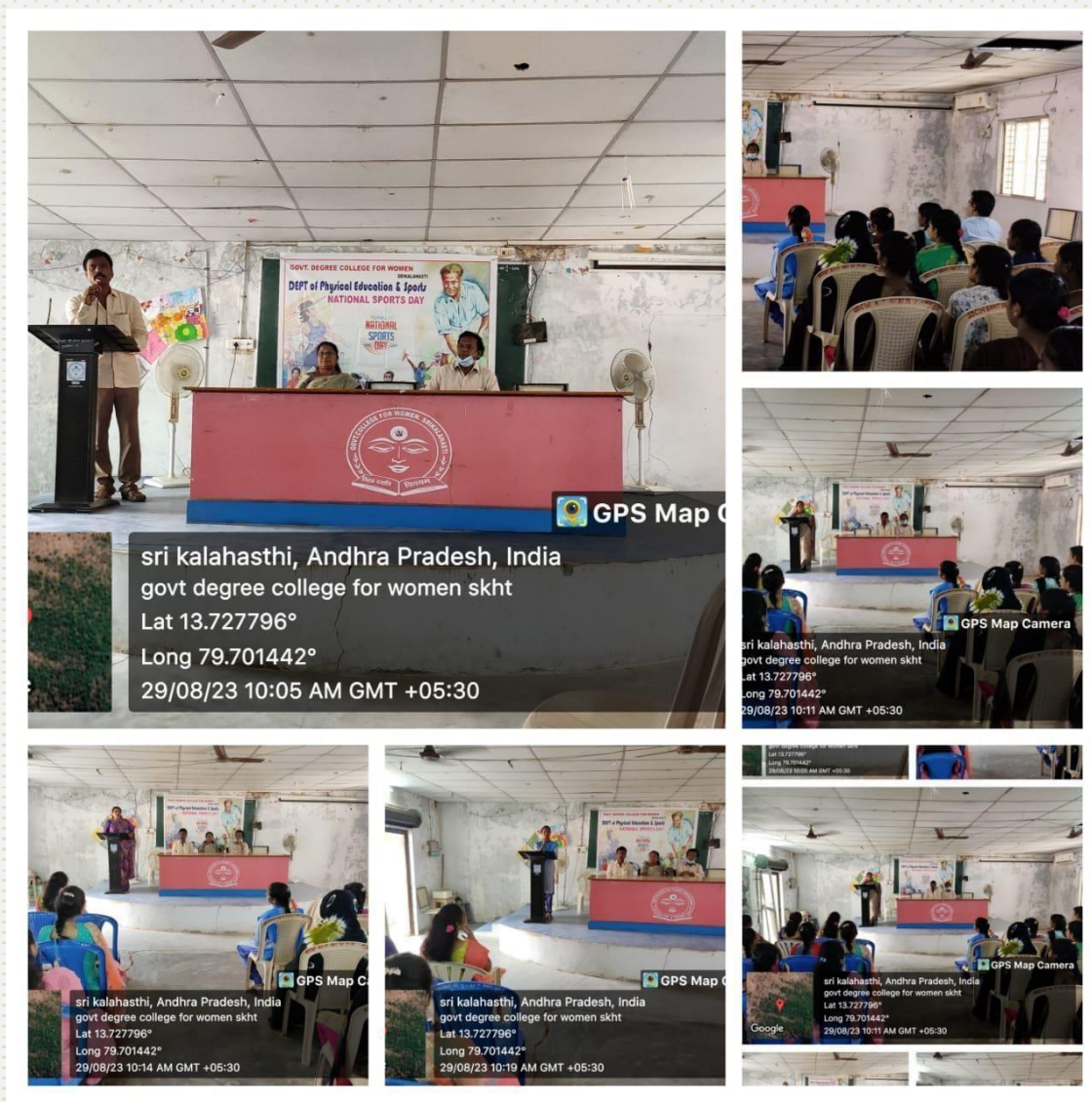




## National Sports Day on 29th August 2023

In this connection, the Department of Physical Education organized an awareness programme on the importance of exercise, sports and games. The staff and students were participated.

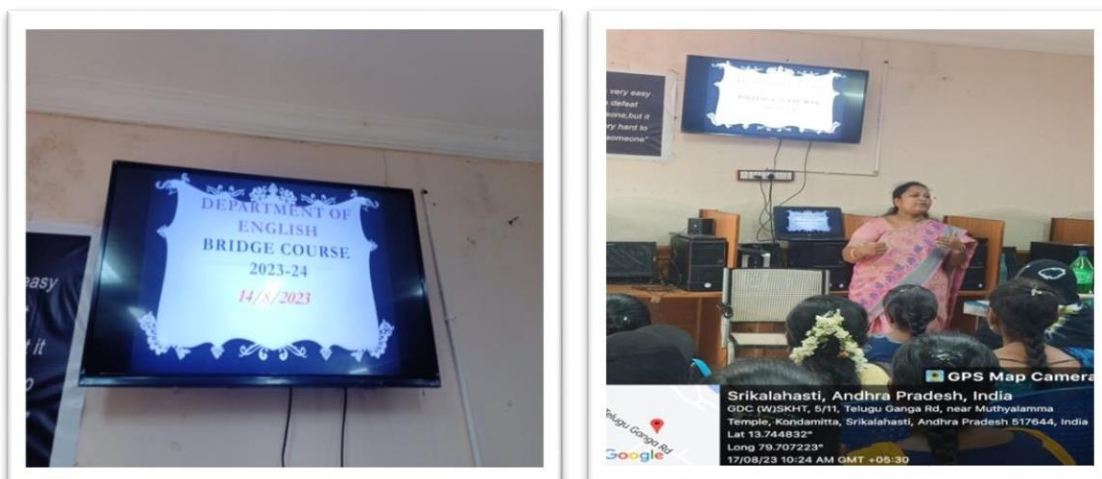




## **BRIDGE COURSE**

Department of English conducted Bridge course to First Year students with an intention of developing their basic skills – LSRW Skills. At the end of the bridge course, an entry level test was conducted. Based on their performance in the exam, students are divided into 3 types -Slow learners moderate and advanced learners.

Day-1 aimed to improve listening skills of students. Brainstorming session on thematic vocabulary was conducted. Students are divided into groups and are asked to list the words related to the given theme. Using Think Pair Share method, students are asked to think any story on their own pair with their friends and share it in the class. JUST A Minute Talk (JAM) -was conducted where students are asked to introduce themselves.

## **READING SKILLS**

The second day started of with reading skill. The students were given articles from newspapers, magazines and short biographies of successful people. The students are instructed to read the given passage proudly, clearly without too many pauses.



### LISTENING SKILL

To improve the listening skills an audio was played followed by question hour students were able to answer the questions after listening carefully to audio played in the class. To improve listening skills of the slow learners audio was played twice.

### WRITING SKILLS

Next day the students are trained in writing skills with an objective to identify sentence structure of English language. This enabled students to write simple sentence and were able to demonstrate improved sentence writing and also to write small paragraphs with clarity. Later a picture is displayed to the students. They are facilitated with helping words. With the help of helping words students are asked to write a paragraph.







### **SPEAKING SKILLS**

Later bridge course focused on their speaking skills. Each student was given a topic and they are asked to speak on it just for a minute. The session ended with onion ring method where the students are divided into two groups in a circle and outer circle to give them practice in interview skills especially self-introduction

## Student Corner

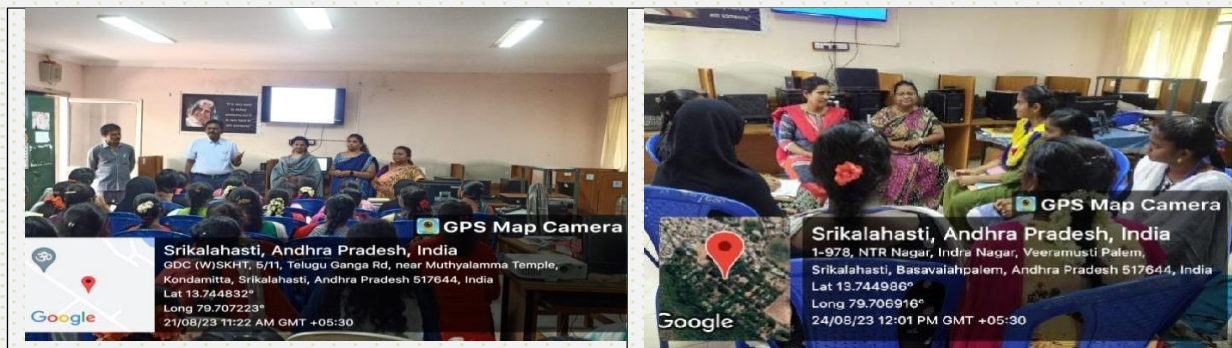

## **Awareness Programme on Consumer Rights Protection Act, 2019**

### **MINISTRY OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION**

#### **(Department of Consumer Affairs)**

#### **NOTIFICATION New Delhi, the 15th July, 2020**

G.S.R. 450(E).—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) and clauses (r) and (zf) of sub-section (2) of section 101 of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 (35 of 2019), the Central Government hereby makes the following rules, namely:—

#### **1. Short title and commencement.—**

- (1) These rules may be called the Consumer Protection (Mediation) Rules, 2020.
- (2) They shall come into force on the 20th day of July, 2020.

#### **2. Definitions—**

- (1) In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—
  - (a) "Act" means the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 (35 of 2019);
  - (b) "Commission" means District Commission, State Commission or National Commission, as the case may be;
  - (c) "mediation cell" means a consumer mediation cell established in accordance with the provisions of section 74; (d) "panel" means a panel of mediators prepared by the Commission under sub-section (1) of section 75;
  - (e) "Parties" means parties to a dispute;
  - (f) "Settlement" means a settlement arrived at in the course of mediation.
- (2) All other words and expressions used in the rules and not defined but defined in the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 (35 of 2019) shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in the Act.

#### **3. Mediation Cell.---** (1) Every Mediation Cell set up in a Commission, shall have a panel of mediators on the recommendation of a selection committee consisting of the President and a member of that Commission.

(2) The Mediation Cell shall have such support staff as may be decided by the President of that Commission in consultation with the concerned Government and that Government shall provide all administrative assistance and infrastructure facilities required by the Commission

#### **4. Matters not to be referred to mediation.---**The following matters shall not be referred to mediation, namely:—

- (a) the matters relating to proceedings in respect of medical negligence resulting in grievous injury or death;
- (b) matters which relate to defaults or offences for which applications for compounding of offences have been made by one or more parties;
- (c) cases involving serious and specific allegations of fraud, fabrication of documents, forgery, impersonation, coercion;
- (d) cases relating to prosecution for criminal and non-compoundable offences;
- (e) cases which involve public interest or the interest of numerous persons who are not parties before the Commission: Provided that, in any case other than those mentioned in this rule, the Commission before which the case is pending may choose not to refer it to mediation if it appears to the Commission that no elements of a settlement exist which may be acceptable to the parties or that mediation is otherwise not appropriate having regard to the circumstances of the case and the respective positions of the parties.

**5. Refund of fee.**—Where the Commission refers the parties to mediation, the complainant shall be entitled to receive full amount of application fee paid in respect of such complaint, if a settlement is reached between such parties.

**6. Resort to arbitral or judicial proceedings.**—The parties shall not initiate any arbitral or judicial proceedings in respect of a matter which is the subject-matter of the mediation and also when such parties have expressly undertaken not to initiate any such proceeding.

**7. Settlement agreement not to be discharged by death of party thereto.**—(1) A settlement agreement shall not be discharged by the death of any party thereto and shall be enforceable by or against the legal representative of the deceased party. (2) Nothing in this rule shall affect the operation of any law by virtue of which any right of action is extinguished by the death of a person.
