#### Celebrations of Guru Pournima on 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2023

Guru Pournima has been observed on 03-07-2023. In connection of this occasion, a meeting with staff and students was convened and explained the importance the day. The celebration of Guru Purnima is marked by spiritual activities and may include a ritualistic event, *Guru puja*, in honor of the guru or teacher. Gurus are believed by many to be the most necessary part of life. On this day, disciples offer *puja* or pay respect to their guru. In addition to having religious importance, this festival has great importance for Indian academics and scholars. Indian academics celebrate this day by thanking their teachers as well as remembering past teachers and scholars.

As per Buddhist tradition, the festival is celebrated by Buddhists in honor of the Buddha, who gave his first sermon on this day at Sarnath, Uttar Pradesh, India. In the yogic tradition, the day is celebrated as the occasion when Shiva became the first guru, as he began the transmission of Yoga to the Saptarishis. In Vedic Hindu tradition, the day is celebrated in honor of the sage Vyasa, who is seen as one of the greatest gurus in ancient Hindu traditions and a symbol of the *guru-shishya* tradition. Vyasa was not only believed to have been born on this day, but also to have started writing the Brahma Sutras on *ashadha sudha padyami*. Their recitations are a dedication to him and are organised on this day, which is also known as *Vyasa Purnima*. The festival is common to all spiritual traditions in Hinduism, where it is an expression of gratitude toward the teacher by his or her disciples. Hindu ascetics and wandering *sanyasis* observe this day by offering *puja* to their guru, during *Chaturmas*, a four-month period during the rainy season, when they choose seclusion and stay at one chosen place; some also give discourses to the local public. Students of Indian classical music and Indian classical dance, who also follow the *guru shishya parampara*, celebrate this holy festival around the world.















## Vana Mahotsav – July First Week

The Van Mahotsav festival of trees is a beautiful initiative to save the environment, to which we owe a lot. Generally, native trees are planted as they readily adapted to the local conditions, integrate into eco-systems and have a high survival rate. Besides, such trees are helpful in supporting local birds, insects and animals as well. State Governments and civic bodies supply saplings to schools, colleges and academic institutions, NGOs and welfare organizations for planting trees. Let us join hands and save mother earth by doing this small contribution.

### Navagraha Plantation by Department of English

Dr. M. Revathi, Lecturer in English has donated NAVAGRAHA PLANTS viz., Calotropis gigantia (Arka), Butee monosperma (Plasha), Acasia catechu (Khadira), Achyranthes aspera (Apamarga), Ficus relisiosa (Ashvatha), Ficus recemosa (Udumbara), Prosopis cineraria (Shamee), Cynodon dactylon (Doovva) and Imperata cylindrical (Dorbha) denotes Sun, Moon, Mars, Mercury, Jupiter, Venus, Saturn, Rahu and Kethu grahas (Planets) respectively to the College Botanical garden.



The words NAVA mean Nine, GRAHA mean Planets, and VANA mean Garden. Life on earth is believed to be affected by the cosmic energies of the Navagraha or nine planets.

According to Hindu tradition, Surya, Chandra, Mangala, Budha, Guru, Shukra, Shani, Raahu & Ketu are the nine grahas. There are nine plants in the Navagraha Vana - trees, shrubs. We need to plant the grass in the proper direction in each plant. In the universe, the grahas are responsible for maintaining overall equilibrium. These grahas have their energy qualities and are said to affect each of us throughout our lives.

Every plant is specially chosen to influence your energy field. The Vedas explain that there are Pavitra Vrikshalu plants at Pragati such as the Nakshatra Vrikshalu, the Rashi

Vrikshalu, Navagraha Vrikshalu, Panchbhoota Vrikshalu, and Parijata Vrikshalu, etc. to accomplish the desired effects.

These trees and medicinal plants that have been preserved in our sacred vanams at Pragati, along with other rare Mother plants are part of our ancient Prana Pradaatalu and Arogya Pradaatalu. Through aromatherapy, these herbs remove toxins and refresh the body. Consequently, Pragati has become a mosquito-free, bacteria-free, virus-free environment. An area of the brain called the limbic system is believed to transmit emotions and retrieve memories.
